Hotel equipment

The hotel purchased three sets of secondhand balls from Sidmouth last year when Sidmouth was upgrading its stock. Two sets of these (primary and secondary colours) are kept locked in <u>our</u> cupboard for use when we run events for the hotel. They are kept in a wooden cradle and can be identified by small silver spots painted on the crown so that they do not get confused with ours. The third set is in the hotel's box of equipment.

Please ensure they do not get mixed up with our own balls (£360 per set) and if, when running an event, the guests wish to continue playing after you leave, the balls should be locked away before you leave and the "normal" hotel balls left for them to use.
