Don Gaunt beat the three times British Open champion Stephen Mulliner, currently ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in Britain and 8<sup>th</sup> in the world, to reach the finals of the Austrian Open Croquet Championship held at Salzberg last month.

Don, ranked 50<sup>th</sup> in Britain and 102<sup>nd</sup> in the world, almost took the title but was beaten by Tony Le Moignan, British number 14 and world number 23. However, he returned home clutching a glass and silver bier stein and automatically qualifies for next year's championship.



#### I wish I had known this before!

I found the following on The Oxford Croquet website. We know that after our ball hits an outside ball in a double banked game, we have to replace the outside ball in its original position and estimate where our ball would have ended. The following is more precise:

Where a Ball Ends Up after a Collision – A Simple Theory. If a moving ball collides with a stationary one, then the moving ball should be replaced along its original trajectory at the point corresponding to the sum of the distances travelled by both balls from the point of collision.



Restoring balls after a collision (Simple Theory). The red ball collides with the blue at point C and the balls are scattered. The red ball should be restored to position F along the original trajectory (black line) where the distance C..F = C..A + C..B

There is another more complex formula that the Australians use, and for Kate, there is a quite hysterical version to be found on the Oxford webpage <a href="https://www.oxfordcroquet.com/tech/collision/index.asp">www.oxfordcroquet.com/tech/collision/index.asp</a> under "Appendix". This is only for mathematicians. You have been warned!
